Who Must Quarantine after Exposure?			
These people <b>DO NOT QUARANTINE</b> but should wear a well-fitting mask for 10 days and get tested on Day 5	These people MUST QUARANTINE		
Students, teachers, and staff who came into close contact with someone with COVID-19 and are in one of the following groups do not need to quarantine:	Students, teachers, and staff who came into close contact with someone with COVID-19 should quarantine for at least 5 days (day 0 through day 5) after their last close contact if they are in one of the following groups:		
<ul> <li>People who are ages 18 and older and have received all recommended vaccine doses, including boosters and additional primary shots for some immunocompromised people.</li> <li>People who are ages 5–17 years and completed the primary series of COVID-19 vaccines.</li> <li>People who had confirmed COVID-19 within the last 90 days (tested positive using a viral test).</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>People who are ages 18 and older and completed the primary series of recommended vaccine, but have not received a recommended booster shot when eligible.</li> <li>People who received the single-dose Johnson &amp; Johnson vaccine (completing the primary series) over 2 months ago and have not received a recommended booster shot.</li> <li>People who are not vaccinated or have not completed a primary vaccine series.</li> </ul>
