Saint Francis International School in Silver Spring is offers a summer academy for students in elementary and middle school. ***Our summer academy is designed to provide both enrichment and remediation depending on each child's individual needs.*** Students who have completed Pre-K 4 through seventh grade are eligible to attend the summer academy. The summer academy will begin with pre-assessments to determine student learning levels and needs which will be used along with a review of each student's report card and consultation with their current teachers and principal to determine what learning standards to focus on during the summer.

The Saint Francis Summer Academy offers various programs to choose from. Please refer to the back of this flier for details on the programs available this summer.

Students will be instructed by career teachers in small groups. Each student will be assessed at the end of the summer and weekly standards-based reports indicating their growth will be provided for their regular school.

The summer academy will run from 8 am to 1 pm Monday through Friday from July 1-26. Tuition for the summer academy is \$600 (or only \$525 for the whole summer if you pay tuition in-full by June 14). Tuition includes textbook materials and *daily breakfast and lunch* for all students.

SFIS offers five different summer academy programs to the unique needs of students. Programs are available for students entering elementary school through those completing middle school.

Tuition for the FOUR-WEEK summer academy is \$600 (tuition discount if paid in-full by June 14) and includes textbooks and materials, online learning tools, regular progress reports, as well as light breakfast and lunch every day.

All Summer Academy programs are open to current SFIS students *as well as students from other public and private schools*. **Here are what we have to offer and who the programs are for:**

- **Math & Language Arts Review & Enrichment** – *for any students currently in grades 1 through 7, especially those who might be struggling with their grades.*

Our traditional summer school program offers intensive math, reading, and writing classes in groups of no more than ten students. The curriculum for summer school is built around the needs and strengths of the children in each class. Students are assessed before and after the summer academy and parents receive weekly progress reports throughout the program.



- **Get Ready for Kindergarten** – *for student currently in Pre-K 4 who will be in Kindergarten in the fall.*

This four week program will reinforce fundamental skills and help students get ready for the new environment of Kindergarten in a fun and engaging way. Emphasis will be put on making sure that the literacy and math skills needed for Kindergarten are mastered. The student to teacher ratio will be no more than one teacher per 12 students.

- **Get Ready for First Grade** – *for students currently in Kindergarten who will be in 1st grade in the fall.*

1st grade brings new responsibilities for students including an emphasis on personal organization and self-motivation. This program is designed to foster rising 1st graders' independence and make sure they have the reading and math skills needed for 1st grade. The student to teacher ratio will be no more than one teacher per 12 students.

- **Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (STEM) Enrichment** – *for students completing grades 4 through 7 who have high marks.*

"SciTech@SFIS" is a summer school program focused on making science and math enjoyable which is led by nationally recognized Advanced Placement Chemistry and Physics teacher Mr. Mike Miehl. Students will use their math and science skills and knowledge to engage in experiments and activities that will let them grow in areas of technology and engineering. Student will come away from this program with greater exposure to technology and engineering concepts as well as stronger math and science skills.

- **Digital Arts Enrichment** – *for students completing grades 4 through 7 who have high marks.*

Professional graphic designer (and Spanish teacher), Ms. Catalina Hernandez will teach middle school students the principles of the design process using Chromebook laptops and traditional media. Students will work on animation, advertisement and editorial design using applied math, language arts, research, visual arts, and technology skills. This project-based "camp" will help answer the question, "When will I use what I am learning?"

Hours of Operation: Before care: 7:30 – 9:00 a.m.
Camp: 9:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.
Aftercare: 4:00 – 6:00 p.m.

Extended Day: Extended Day (from 7:30 - 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 - 6:00 p.m.) is open to all campers. During the extended day program, students may play board games, color, draw, watch age appropriate movies (during inclement weather) and play outdoors. **Camp is closed on Wednesday, July 4th. There will be no extended day on Friday, July 27th.** There is a mandatory \$1.00 per minute fee, per child, for students remaining past 6:00 p.m. This fee is to be paid in cash when the child is picked up or the next day. Your child may not return to camp until this fee is paid.

Camp Attire: No flip flops, halter tops, crop tops, midriffs, t-shirts with inappropriate slogans or shorts that are too tight or revealing.
