# ALICE Evacuation Drill Social Story Template

# Instructions for Use:

1. Add photos of your school setting, students, and anything else you think would be useful to your student(s).
  - To add images, click the Placeholder image and choose the image you want to use on that page from your computer.
2. Add text (as needed) to describe your photos.
3. Review social story and edit as needed to ensure that language, readability, illustrations and length are appropriate for your student(s).
4. Read the social story to your student(s) frequently.
  - Review story before and after drills.
  - Add copy of the social story to your “go bag” to read during drills as needed.
  - Send a copy of the story home with your student(s) and encourage their families to read it with them frequently.
