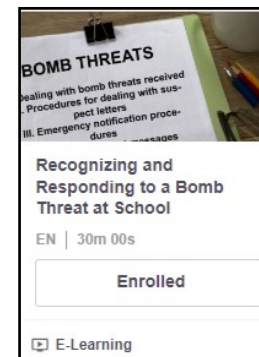
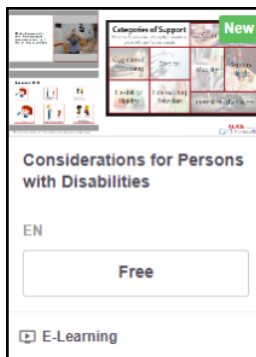
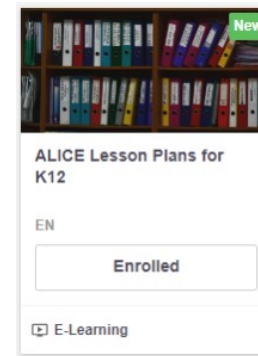
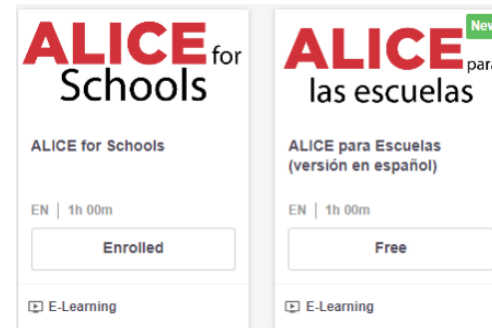
Teachers can download lesson plans by grade band

6. Practice, practice, practice!

A.L.I.C.E. DRILL DO'S AND DON'TS

+ <u>DO</u>	⊘ <u>DON'T</u>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do share outdoor evacuation routes and rally points with all participants 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't have an unplanned/unannounced ALICE Response Drill--Ever
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do Inform: Students, faculty and staff, before/aftercare, subs, lunch crew, custodial help, parents, parish staff/pastor, neighbors, law enforcement, any volunteers who may be present, and the CSO of your drill plans! 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't run during the drill, we can teach the concept without risking injury to students and faculty/staff
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do share your reunification location (even if you don't journey there during drill) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't drill with fake weapons with students
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do check your communications system before/during drill (walkie talkie, Zello, group text, etc.) 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't use sounds of gunfire or terrifying noises with students
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do consider and plan for your students with physical or emotional needs 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't use fake blood in drills – this is good for first responders and soldiers, not young children
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do create a plan of progression that builds from simplest, lowest-cost training; identifies obstacles and goals; and establishes a timeline 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't surprise your reunification host with unannounced drill
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Do brief and debrief your team to discuss details/outcomes before and after drill 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Don't incorporate unnecessary risks into your drills (2nd story evacuations, dangerous climbs, breaking glass, etc.)
