UPDATED Quarantine & Isolation Guidance (1/14/2022)

ISOLATION – Positive Case

The Archdiocese <u>recommends that</u> <u>vaccinated employees obtain a negative</u> <u>rapid test and requires that</u> <u>unvaccinated employees obtain a</u> <u>negative rapid test</u> before returning to work after 5 days. Any employee who returns to work after 5 days must also continue wearing a mask for another 5 days.	 Stay home for at least 5 full days from the date of symptom onset if symptomatic or the date of the positive test if no symptoms. After Day 5, if the person has no symptoms or if symptoms are improved and they have had no fever for at least 24 hours without medication, they may return to school or childcare PROVIDED they wear a well-fitting mask when around others* for an additional 5 days. If the person is unable to wear a mask around others, they should remain at home for a full 10 days. Unmasked time should be minimized and physical distancing and ventilation maximized during these times. People should not be participating in any other activities unmasked. 	• Stay home for at least 10 full days from the date of symptom onset if symptomatic or the date of the positive test if no symptoms.

If the person is unable to mask around others, they should remain at home for 10 days from the date of last close contact 	 Stay home for at least 10 days after the last close contact If the person develops symptoms they should get tested immediately and remain at home; if the test is positive, they should follow the recommendations for isolation above. If no symptoms, get tested at least 5 days after the last close contact. o If the child tests negative or unable to get a test, they may return to childcare 10 days after their last close contact; o If the child tests positive, they should follow the recommendations for isolation above.

*NOTE: For people who are returning either from isolation (after a positive COVID-19 test) or quarantine (after exposure), the recommendation is that masks may be removed only when eating and during naptime. Unmasked time should be minimized and physical distancing and ventilation maximized during these times. People should not be participating in any other activities unmasked.
