Follow guidance for Quarantine for Students in K-12 Schools	 Stay home for at least 5 days (unless you qualify for DO NOT QUARANTINE below) after the last close contact with the person with COVID-19 (Day 1 is considered the first full day after the date of last close contact) If no symptoms, get tested at least 5 days after the last close contact. If the person tests negative, they may return to school or child care IF they wear a well-fitting mask when around others* until 10 days after their last close contact; If the person is unable to get a test, they may return to school or child care after Day 5 IF they wear a well-fitting mask when around others. If the person is unable to mask around others, they should remain at home for 10 days from the date of last close contact.
