Description:

The Cardinal's Medal is awarded annually, by the Archdiocese of Washington, to a graduating senior from each of the archdiocesan high schools - Archbishop Carroll High School and Don Bosco Cristo Rey High School. The student, selected by the high school president (CEO), exemplifies traits that model solid Christian values that are practiced, a growing Catholic spirituality, and commitment to service as a peer minister. The awardees are recognized because they are a model for other students and faculty, demonstrating a lively Catholic faith, rooted in the beliefs and traditions of the Catholic Church. Each year, the medallion is emblazoned with the coat of arms of the current Archbishop of Washington. The Cardinal's Medal, along with a \$1,500 scholarship, is awarded by the Archbishop of Washington (or his designee) at the annual baccalaureate Mass for each school.

We affirm all the positive moments, Of insight, of the excitement of learning, Of accomplishment, of creativity, Of laughter, of a sense of community.


We recognize the times of struggle, Of difficult work, of misunderstanding, Even of failure—we give these To you for transformation, So they can become seeds That will find fertile soil.

Culminating retreat for Catechist Certification


