
THE FRIDAY UPDATE

The month of November is Black Catholic History Month!

During this month, chosen because the feast of St. Martin de Porres and the birthday of St. Augustine are celebrated in November, we look at the important contributions black Catholics have brought to enrich the Church.

To celebrate this month, our Archdiocese of Washington department of Cultural Diversity and Outreach in conjunction with the Tolton Ambassadors DC - USCCB - Daniel Rudd Fund - Archdiocese of Cincinnati - Chicago - Tolton Spirituality Center will be hosting a lecture series entitled Celebrating the Cloud of Witnesses: Race, Resilience and Renewal. Spread over three Saturdays in November, the Zoom series will examine the lives of black Catholics who are currently in different stages of the canonization process. The series will conclude on November 28 with the consistory of Cardinal-designate Gregory. This program is free and will be a great resource for those looking to learn more about these holy men and women.

Cardinal-designate Gregory recently addressed Catholic school leaders across the country saying, "How can a child aspire to be what God calls them to be if they do not see and study people, to whom they can relate; people who look like them and have 'walked in their shoes." The 2021–2022 Enrollment Forecaster will be provided to all school leaders during the week of November 16, 2020. The Enrollment Forecaster is customized for use by each archdiocesan elementary school. The document provides the following data to support schools with the enrollment forecasting process.

- Historical school enrollment data
- Current and historical parish and school census data
- Parish registration data
- Parish Sacrament data
- Retention rate data

The virtual presentation and workshop will provide school leaders with an overview of the enrollment forecasting tool, process and training. All principals are welcome to attend. All new principals during the current and previous academic years will be invited.
