

GOLDEN APPLE AWARDS

On May 16, 2019 the Archdiocese of Washington Catholic Schools will host the eleventh annual Golden Apple Awards for excellence in teaching. Ten of our teachers will be honored for their outstanding teaching and commitment to Catholic education.

The Golden Apple Award is the creation of the Donahue Family Foundation. Mr. and Mrs. Jack Donahue are parents of 13 children, all of whom were educated in Catholic schools. Eager to express their deep appreciation to Catholic school teachers for providing a quality academic and faith-filled education for their children, the Foundation has established this award in four dioceses around the country.

Teachers, parents and students are invited annually to nominate a teacher for the Golden Apple Award and submit a nomination form to their principal by January 7, 2019. All individuals nominated are then to complete a Golden Apple application form to submit to their principal by January 14, 2019. After reviewing the nomination forms and applications forms, a committee at each school will select one teacher that will represent the school by January 21, 2019. The selected teacher's application is then scanned and attached to an email to Wendy Anderson (andersonw@adw.org) at the Catholic Schools Office by January 28, 2018. Applications will only be accepted electronically in a single PDF document. Binders will not be accepted. The CSO will send an email to the principal when the application is received. A selection committee made up of former Golden Apple winners, administrators, board members and parents will then evaluate the entries and chose 10 winners with the approval of the Superintendent of Catholic Schools and the Archdiocesan Secretary for Education. No one on the selection committee will be from a school that has a nominee. A dinner in honor of the winners will be held in Washington DC on May 10, 2018 where each of the 10 teachers will be presented a golden apple, a Certificate of Achievement, and a check for \$5,000.

Attached is the <u>nomination form</u>, the <u>application form</u> and <u>information on the process</u> for your review. Please distribute the nomination form to your school parents and teachers through your weekly communication method and publicize the award. We encourage all schools to participate and celebrate the extraordinary teachers who provide such benefit to our Catholic schools.

This year the nomination and award process is taking place earlier. Please note these dates.

CARDINAL BAUM SCHOLARSHIP

Archdiocese of Washington Cardinal Baum Scholarship Program

Application Deadline: Friday, January 18, 2019

Each year, <u>Cardinal Baum Scholarships</u> are awarded to outstanding elementary and secondary teachers in the Archdiocese of Washington (ADW) to help them offset the cost of tuition for a Master's or PhD program at a Catholic college or university. This year the ADW will award \$15,000 in scholarships to select elementary and secondary school teachers who:

- ⇒ Are currently teaching full-time at an elementary or high school in the ADW
- ⇒ Have taught in the Archdiocese for at least three years
- ⇒ Are currently enrolled in, or have been admitted to, a Master's or PhD program related to their teaching assignment at a Catholic college or university
- ⇒ Have maintained at least a 3.0 average in their graduate coursework

Applicants must submit the following:

- ★ A completed application form
- ↑ 1 2 page statement of your professional goals as a Catholic school teacher
- ★ A letter of recommendation from your current principal
- ★ An official copy of your graduate transcript
- ★ A tuition bill that includes proof of payment

All applications and supporting documents must be received by January 18, 2019.

Science Assessment

As a reminder, only Maryland schools with students who have received BOOST scholarship monies for the 2018-2019 school year are required to give the Science Assessment in grades 5 and 8.

All schools are encouraged to administer the assessment to students.

Testing Windows:

Grade 8: April 1 − 17 Grade 5: May 1 - 31



Scantron Mid-Year Testing

The window for the Math and Reading Scantron Mid-Year Test is January 2 through February 23, 2019.

Principals have the option of only testing students in the bottom two quartiles for the Mid-Year Test. Students that had an NPR score of 0% to 49% on the Baseline Test must take the Mid-Year Test.

To get a list of students by performance bands, follow the steps below:

- 1. Click on the Reports tab
- 2. Click on Current Scores under Performance
- 3. Under the Performance Bands column, click on Reading or Math
- 4. Click on the name of your school
- 5. Click on Students
- 6. Click on the Grade header to sort the list by grade
- 7. Students with a rating of Below Average or Low Average must be tested.




