


BOOST

The format of the tuition policy statement is at the discretion of the school as long as the requirements of the Archdiocesan tuition policy statement, which are listed below, are contained in each school's tuition policy statement.

Archdiocesan School Tuition Policy Statement – Policy #4330

All Archdiocesan Catholic Schools shall publish a written tuition policy statement that details the total cost, tuition rates, payment schedules, methods of payments and consequences of non-payment of tuition.

The written tuition statement shall be published no later than February 1 for the coming school year.

Certified Medication Technician (CMT) Training

CMT training will be offered by the CSO. The training is approved by the Maryland State Department of Education (MSDE) and certification from the Maryland Board of Nursing (MBON). This employee is working under the supervision of a trained delegating nurse.

Criteria for CMT Training

- Employee of the school & is returning for the next school year
- High School Graduate, 18 years or older
- Pass a basic math and reading test
- Complete a 20-hour training program
- A delegating nurse is assigned to the school

<u>PURPOSE</u>: To support Archdiocesan teachers with mini grants to develop and implement engaging, innovative classroom-based instructional projects that increase students' knowledge on a particular topic.

ELIGIBILITY: All PreK-8 full-time and part-time teachers, including core and auxiliary courses. Teachers can submit an application individually, or collaborate with one or more teachers at their school. The grant award will be the same, regardless of the number of teachers on the application. Teachers who received an incentive grant in the previous school year are not eligible the next year.

<u>ELIGIBLE PROJECTS</u>: Be creative!! This grant is supplemental and therefore, the funds should be used to do something you wouldn't otherwise have the opportunity to do. The grant should not replace local or school funds for activities already occurring in the classroom. Think about how you can enhance a unit you will be teaching or expand a program you are currently doing. Activities should be creative and extend the curriculum.

<u>ELIGIBLE ITEMS</u>: Instructional materials, including but not limited to books, math or other classroom manipulatives, supplies and materials, computer software, technology, etc.

<u>INELIGIBLE ITEMS</u>: Grants cannot be used for classroom furniture, field trips or guest speakers and cannot supplant local funds (i.e. workbooks for your Math curriculum that couldn't be afforded).

AWARDS: Maximum award \$800
