#### MENTAL HEALTH AWARENESS MONTH

Social media use and Mental Health: recommendations from the American psychological Association (APA)

In an effort to provide guidance to educators, parents, policymakers, mental health and health practitioners, technology companies and youths themselves, APA President, Dr. Thema Bryant formed an advisory panel to examine relevant scientific literature to formulate 10 recommendations to ensure that adolescents develop healthy social media practices. Officials and policymakers including the U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy have documented the importance of this issue and are actively seeking science-informed input.

#### A few recommendations include:

- Tailor social media use, functionality and permissions to youths' developmental capabilities; designs created for adults may not be appropriate for children.
- For younger kids, adults should monitor social media use, including discussing and coaching around social media content. This should be balanced with youths' appropriate needs for privacy. Autonomy may increase gradually as kids age and gain more digital literacy skills.
- Minimize adolescents' exposure to social media content that depicts illegal or
  psychologically maladaptive behavior, including content that instructs or encourages youth
  to engage in self-harm or high-risk behaviors or those that encourage eating-disordered
  behavior (such as restrictive eating, purging or excessive exercise).
