

Pree Webinar: 2022 National Summit on K-12 School Safety and Security

The Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) will host the inaugural National Summit on K-12 School Safety and Security on November 1-3, 2022. This three-day, virtual event (2:00 – 4:00 each day) will convene school safety experts, practitioners, and leaders from across the country to discuss current threats in school safety and explore research-informed strategies for addressing security challenges and risks in K-12 schools. Emergency Drill Reminder: Practice and document fire drills (monthly), safe weather drills (twice per year), emergency evacuation drills – 500+ feet (twice per year), and ALICE related drills (twice per year). Continue to review your School Emergency Response Plan with faculty and staff. To reinforce understanding of the school emergency plans, it is sometimes better to talk it through before you walk it through.



- Expect updates in Frontline provided from schools in a two-week turnaround. Please note, if you have not yet responded and sent in your school's updated information, please do so as soon as possible.

All school employees need to be updated in the Frontline Data Management System in order for principals to be able to upload applicable evaluation forms and be in compliance with policy 3443 (page 17, ADW CSO Policy Manual). Scheduling Frontline Tasks



Committee meetings will be held virtually during the school year beginning in January 2023. Committee members will be selected among those interested based on the data-informed curricular needs of RCADW schools. October 28th, 8 AM-3:30 PM with lunch at Noon

Breakout sessions will be differentiated by position/grade/content. Learning targets include but are not limited to:

- Define key metrics/terms that influence instruction/assessments
- Using class and student reports, interpret student performance data in relation to NWEA normative data and other comparative data
- Identify opportunities to implement equitable data practices
- Understand why it is important to employ assessment empowerment as an equitable teaching practice
- Meet student needs by identifying targeted instructional groups based on MAP Growth goal area performance data. Boost differentiation efforts by connecting groups of students to standards in the Learning Continuum.

There will be breakout sessions for classroom, resource, and special education teachers, counselors, admissions and enrollment personnel and school administrators.
