




Early Childhood Updates

Collaboration Day (Virtual) Snapshot

October 28th, 8 AM-3 PM with lunch at Noon

Breakout sessions will be differentiated by position/grade/content. Learning targets include but are not limited to:

- Define key metrics/terms that influence instruction/assessments
- Using class and student reports, interpret student performance data in relation to NWEA normative data and other comparative data
- Identify opportunities to implement equitable data practices
- Understand why it is important to employ assessment empowerment as an equitable teaching practice
- Meet student needs by identifying targeted instructional groups based on MAP Growth goal area performance data. Boost differentiation efforts by connecting groups of students to standards in the Learning Continuum.

There will be breakout sessions for classroom, resource, and special education teachers, counselors, admissions and enrollment personnel and school administrators. The Collaboration Day agenda will be shared soon as details are finalized.

Role Assignment(s) and Accommodations

ADW NWEA MAP Growth Role Assignment

Data Administrators at the school level cannot assign roles but can adjust profile settings to add multi-instructor classes to support grade level/middle school teams or building needs as applicable and designated by the school principal. While the data administrator role can view ADW student rosters, student data is not visible.

ADW Assigning Accommodations in NWEA MAP Growth

NWEA MAP Growth has embedded features (text-to-speech, calculator, ruler, magnification, etc.) that the test developer has deemed appropriate based on research and data norms. These designated features do not require supporting documentation (e.g., Catholic Accommodation Plan or Individual Catholic Education Plan). These features will appear when the assessment is deemed appropriate and are not available for student use throughout the assessment. However, if a student does have a CAP or ICEP in place with supporting documentation, these features can be "turned on" for identified students. If there is no plan with supporting documentation these accommodations cannot be activated. Please contact the Catholic Schools Office with any questions.

2022 High School Principal Association Teacher of the Year Award

Each of the Catholic High Schools in the Archdiocese of Washington are invited to participate in the 2022 High School Principal Association Teacher of the Year Award by selecting **two** teachers of the year, to be featured in the Catholic Standard.

The High School Principal Association Teacher of the Year Awards were established to recognize the devotion of veteran and novice Catholic secondary school teachers in the Archdiocese of Washington. They speak to the value we all place on faithful service, excellence, best practices, and innovations in Catholic secondary school teaching. We look forward to receiving your nominations to recognize two teachers from among your many distinguished and dedicated faculty.

The archdiocese will have plaques made for all Catholic schools that choose to participate in this award program. Using the <u>online award winner form</u>, please provide the name of the awardees from your school no later than **Monday**, **October 3**, **2022**.

The general criteria for each award is as follows:

- A teacher selected from your **veteran** faculty pool, and
- Another teacher selected from your **novice** teachers in their first, second, or third year

Veteran Teachers

The 2022 High School Principal Association Teacher of the Year Award recognizes a veteran teacher from each Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of Washington who embrace teaching as a ministry, proclaims the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and demonstrates respect for the Catholic identity and the charism of his/her school. This awardee must have **completed four years** of fulltime service at your high school.

2022 High School Principal Association Teacher of the Year Award continue...

Awardees will possess the following characteristics:

- Models a leadership style of respect to all members of the school community;
- Manifests a desire for academic excellence through continuous personal and professional growth;
- Assumes responsibility for development of the whole student;
- Engages in teaching within and outside the classroom that fosters the God-given talents and gifts of every student; and
- Seeks to transform students by responding to Gospel call for peace and justice

Novice teachers

The 2022 High School Principal Association Teacher of the Year Award recognizes a new teacher, from each Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of Washington, who embraces teaching as a ministry, proclaims the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and demonstrates respect for the Catholic identity and the charism of his/her school. This awardee must have completed their first, second, or third year of fulltime teaching at your high school.

Awardees will possess the following characteristics:

- Demonstrates a commitment of the spiritual growth of the school community;
- Manifests a desire for academic excellence and commitment to professional standards;
- Demonstrates pedagogical awareness that includes both generic and content-specific techniques;
- Recognizes the necessity for development of the whole student; and
- Cares deeply about the well-being of students, earning the respect of both students and teachers, alike

Each high school may add its own criteria around the universal characteristics of the award. The selection of the two Teachers of the Year should be either by faculty vote or other representative process. There is only one of each award per school. Veteran awardees will receive a monetary award and a plaque. New teacher awardees will receive a plaque.

2022-2023 Leadership Academy

The Catholic Schools Office will offer, once again, the Leadership Academy for 2022-2023. We are inviting one assistant principal or teacher-leader from each of our schools to participate in this academy. If you sent a faculty member last year, I ask that you consider selecting a different person for this year's academy.

The academy will take place on five one-half days, throughout the school year. Goal is to provide an opportunity for the participants to explore various leadership topics. Each participant will be asked to complete a school improvement project; each may choose a topic from one of the four pillars of Catholic education. Examples of topics that will be covered are instructional leadership, Catholic identity, marketing and enrollment, and school safety. Participation in the academy will mean five one-half days away from your building for your assistant principal or teacher-leader, and I hope you agree that it will be advantageous to the growth of the participant and for your school.

The academy will be capped at 35 participants. Selected candidates will also receive a notification of their acceptance.
