
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A MESSAGE FROM OUR SECRETARY FOR CATHOLIC SCHOOLS...



HSPT Registration Reminders

- Registration for the HSPT will open on **Monday**, **October 3**, **2022**.
- Attending students will access the registration form through the ADW Catholic Schools website by selecting the button option "My student currently attends an ADW elementary school." The link can be found <u>HERE</u> and in Appendix B. Please note this button will not be available until 9AM on October 3.
- The window for selecting High School Choice(s) will open at the same time as registration, on **Monday**, **October 3**, **2022**. Students and parent/guardian may modify their High School Choice(s) up until **Sunday**, **December 11**, **2022**.
- School leaders are asked to distribute both the letter and registration instructions in Appendix B to parents/guardians at the appropriate time.

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SAVE THE DATE

Collaboration Day (Virtual) Snapshot October 28th 8 AM-3 PM with lunch at Noon

Breakout sessions will be differentiated by position/grade/content

Learning targets include but are not limited to:

- Define key metrics/terms that influence instruction/assessments
- Using class and student reports, interpret student performance data in relation to NWEA normative data and other comparative data
- Identify opportunities to implement equitable data practices
- Understand why it is important to employ assessment empowerment as an equitable teaching practice
- Meet student needs by identifying targeted instructional groups based on MAP Growth goal area performance data. Boost differentiation efforts by connecting groups of students to standards in the Learning Continuum.

There will be breakout sessions for classroom, resource, and special education teachers, counselors, admissions and enrollment personnel and school administrators. The Collaboration Day agenda will be shared soon as details are finalized.

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NWEA MAP TESTING

Accommodations at-a-glance

Accommodations should be outlined on the child's Catholic Accommodation Plan (CAP) or Individualized Catholic Education Plan (ICEP)

- For K-2nd grade students, accommodations should be determined ahead of time (and documented) by the student's academic team (classroom teacher, resource teacher, and principal) or documented on a CAP or ICEP.
- For students in 3rd grade or above, accommodations should be documented on a CAP or ICEP.

Common Accommodation Notes:

- Extended time and breaks are already individualized for students (no further action is needed)
- Provide blank paper and writing tools or whiteboard and marker to all students (please collect and dispose of scratch paper after test).
- Calculators
 - Physical calculators need to be supplied for the calculator accommodation.
 - The embedded calculator only pops up for specific questions.
- Read-Aloud
 - Students who have a read-aloud accommodation (who are reading the test aloud) need to take the test in a 1:1 setting.
 - If a read-aloud is needed for specific subjects, and the child does not have an additional small group or 1:1 accommodation, you only need to have the child test 1:1 for the specified subject test.
- Read-to (must be individually assigned to students before testing-when creating the test session)
 - Students with a read-to (text-to-speech) can take the test in a room with others, with high-quality headphones.
 - The text-to-speech feature should be turned on prior to the child taking the test.
 - A human reader is still an option if that works better for your school team or the child.
- Multiplication Table
 - Should be given a hard copy (not digital)
 - Should be single digit (1-9)
