# Prayer to St. Joseph


Hail, Guardian of the Redeemer, Spouse of the Blessed Virgin Mary.

All Archdiocesan elementary schools shall develop a daily schedule by grade level consistent with the minimum requirements of instructional minutes required in the Catholic Schools Office guidelines. Total instructional minutes shall be submitted to the Catholic Schools Office with the school calendar (Policy 3532).

Schools are required to be in session for a minimum of 6.5 hours per day, Monday through Friday, exclusive of applicable Holy Days, holidays, and any other pertinent events or activities as indicated on the school calendar

Minutes can be met on a daily or weekly basis:

- Homeroom in non-instructional time unless a teacher is conducting and documenting instruction
- Students will participate in a physical education program (COMAR 13A.04.13.01)
- Students may specialize in one or more of the fine art forms of dance, media arts, music, theatre, and visual art (COMAR 13A.04.16.01)
- World Language Requirement Each local school system shall provide a comprehensive, sequential world languages instructional program beginning not later than the middle learning years (COMAR 13A.04.11.01)
- Liturgy within the school day may be counted toward religion instructional minutes


