A.L.I.C.E. DRILL DO'S AND DON'TS

| <u>DO</u> | O DON'T |
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| • Do share outdoor evacuation routes and rally points with all participants | • Don't have an unplanned/unannounced ALICE Response DrillEver |
| • Do Inform: Students, faculty and staff, before/aftercare, subs, lunch crew, custodial help, parents, parish staff/pastor, neighbors, law enforcement, any volunteers who may be present, and the CSO of your drill plans! | • Don't run during the drill, we can teach the concept without risking injury to students and faculty/staff |
| • Do share your reunification location (even if you don't journey there during drill) | • Don't drill with fake weapons with students |
| • Do check your communications system before/during drill (walkie talkie, Zello, group text, etc.) | • Don't use sounds of gunfire or terrifying noises with students |
| • Do consider and plan for your students with physical or emotional needs | • Don't use fake blood in drills – this is good for first responders and soldiers, not young children |
| • Do create a plan of progression that builds from simplest, lowest-cost training; identifies obstacles and goals; and establishes a timeline | • Don't surprise your reunification host with unannounced drill |
| • Do brief and debrief your team to discuss details/outcomes before and after drill | • Don't incorporate unnecessary risks into your drills (2 nd story evacuations, dangerous climbs, breaking glass, etc.) |
