Students receive rigorous college preparatory, honors and Advanced Placement curricula in a values-based environment with scheduling that allows for flexibility. The faculty is committed to being accessible to students and parents and has a genuine interest in the students' success. Tutors and mentors are available in all subjects.

As a Catholic high school, St. Mary's Ryken offers a foundational and fundamental theology and philosophy program based on the teachings of the Church. This four-year program scaffolds a fuller understanding of the Bible, the importance of integrity and morality, and a deeper awareness for mutual respect and social justice.

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SCHOLARS PROGRAM AND PROJECT LEAD THE WAY

The St. Mary's Ryken Scholars Program offers students the chance to specialize in a particular academic pathway. Project Lead the Way, the nation's leading provider of STEM programs, defines the Engineering, Biomedical, and Computer Science pathways. Other pathways include Global and International Studies, Humanities, and the Visual and Performing Arts. Students complete an application process to be accepted into the SMR Scholars Program.

All students with a strong academic background may take AP courses. The following AP courses are offered:

- **Arts:** Art History, Music Theory, Studio Art (2-D Design and Drawing)
- **World Languages & Culture:** French Language & Culture, Latin, Spanish Language & Culture
- **English:** English Language & Composition, English Literature & Composition
- **History & Social Science:** Research and Seminar, Human Geography, Macroeconomics, Microeconomics, Psychology, United States Government and Politics, United States History, World History
- **Math & Computer Science:** Calculus AB, Calculus BC, Computer Science A, Computer Science Principles, Statistics
- **Sciences:** Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Science, Physics C (Electricity & Magnetism and Mechanics)

DUAL ENROLLMENT

With the flexibility of our new schedule, the number of SMR students pursuing dual enrollment courses

continues to grow. Students can access these opportunities on both the SMR campus and on the campuses of the College of Southern Maryland.

THE CLASS OF 2020

- 162 graduates
- Offers of admission from 238 colleges and universities
- 32 were accepted into honors programs
- 27 AP Scholars

- 58% of students received scholarship offers

- 91% of students are pursuing higher education in a four-year or two-year college, with the remaining pursuing opportunities in the armed services, volunteer and religious services and the workforce
