APPLYING TO A CATHOLIC HIGH SCHOOL

CRITERIA FOR ADMISSIONS

Students apply to a Catholic high school by completing the high school's application form. Grades, test scores, and in some cases, an interview are considered by Catholic high schools in determining admission for each student. PLACEMENT TESTING

A placement test is required by all Catholic high schools unless otherwise indicated by the high school. This section pertains to registering for and taking the High School Placement Test (HSPT). For testing instructions for those Catholic high schools that do not require the HSPT, please refer to the school's website.

HIGH SCHOOL PLACEMENT TEST

The High School Placement Test (HSPT) is a five-part multiple-choice test of verbal, quantitative, reading, mathematics, and language arts skills. The exam takes 3 hours to administer, which includes two short breaks and 30 minutes for distributing and collecting the answer sheets and test booklets. Subtests and standard testing time limits are as follows: 16 minutes for verbal ability; 30 minutes for quantitative ability; 25 minutes for reading achievement; 45 minutes for mathematics achievement; and 25 minutes for language arts.



PROCESS FOR STUDENTS ATTENDING A CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Catholic school students in the Archdiocese of Washington take the HSPT at their schools on Wednesday, December 3, 2025. Principals in the Archdiocese of Washington Catholic schools provide 8th-grade students and their parents/guardians with the link to the online HSPT registration form. Parents/guardians complete the registration and payment for the test online. Students and their parents/guardians will also select the high schools to receive the results of the HPST at the time of registration (Please see the High School Choice(s) section on page 8). Online test registration opens on Monday, October 6, 2025. Test registration and payment must be submitted by Monday, December 1, 2025. A confirmation letter is sent via email to the parent/guardian.

Students who require testing accommodations must have a current ICEP or CAP on file with the school, clearly documenting the specific accommodations. There is no need to indicate accommodations on the registration form. For questions, please contact your child's current school directly.

PROCESS FOR STUDENTS NOT ENROLLED IN A CATHOLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOL

Students attending schools that do not administer the HSPT may register and pay for the HSPT online at www.adwcatholicschools.org/high-school. Online registration for the HSPT opens on Monday, October 6, 2025, and closes the Sunday before the test date or when all testing locations have reached capacity.

ACCOMMODATIONS FOR STUDENTS The Roman Catholic Archdiocese of Washington has an inclusive philosophy for accommodating students. All testing sites will offer standard and accommodated testing conditions, which may include testing in an accommodated testing room. There is an approval process for accommodations that is tied to testing registration. All accommodations will be finalized before the testing date and communicated with the HSPT Site Coordinator at each location. Accommodation approvals are individualized, and some students with accommodations may be best served in the general testing environment.

Parents/guardians must provide the requested documentation for their child's accommodation needs with their online HSPT Registration Form. There is a designation for accommodated seating that must be selected during registration to approve the accommodations. Documentation must be submitted before the test date to ensure accommodations can be arranged. Therefore, documentation must be received by **Tuesday**, **November 18**, **2025**, for the December 6, 2025 testing date, and by **Tuesday**, **November 25**, **2025**, for the December 13, 2025 testing date. The deadline to submit documentation for the January 10, 2026, test date is **Tuesday**, **December 16**, **2025**, or upon registration.

Appropriate documentation may be uploaded to the registration site. A lack of documentation supporting accommodations may result in a child being unable to test with accommodations on their selected testing date or at their preferred location. Parents/guardians will receive a confirmation of the approved accommodations via email from the testing registration website. During the admissions/enrollment process, parents/guardians should provide the high school(s) with similar information regarding their child's educational needs to ensure accurate placement. The Archdiocese of Washington is not able to share supporting documentation with schools.

The HSPT for students not attending Catholic schools that administer the HSPT is offered at several sites on three dates. The HSPT begins promptly at 9:00 a.m. All students must be registered. No walk-ins are permitted.

JANUARY TEST DATE

The third test date, **Saturday**, **January 10**, **2026**, is the **final testing date offered**. This date primarily serves as a make-up opportunity for students who are unable to attend one of the December test dates due to illness or other extenuating circumstances. Priority seating will be given to these students.

Registration for this test date will open at the same time as registration for the December testing dates and will remain open until Sunday, January 4, 2026, or until capacity is reached.

SEVERE WEATHER POSTPONEMENTS

In the event of severe weather that requires postponement of the HSPT, the affected test date will be rescheduled for the following Saturday. Please visit www.adwcatholicschools.org or tune in to local news outlets for weather-related updates.

PROCEDURE FOR STUDENTS WHO MISS TEST DATE DUE TO ILLNESS

To reschedule a missed HSPT date due to illness, the parent/guardian must send an email to HSPT@adw.org, no later than the Monday following the missed test date. There will be no make-up opportunity offered by the Archdiocese of Washington beyond the January test date.

ITEMS TEST-TAKERS MUST BRING ON THE DAY OF THE TEST

Students who are registered to take the HSPT on a Saturday must bring the following items to the testing site:

- Two No. 2 pencils;
- Valid picture ID (if possible) or other appropriate personal identification documentation;
- Light snack & water bottle (recommended); and
- Registration confirmation letter
- Calculator, if the student has been pre-approved to receive this testing accommodation

HIGH SCHOOLS CHOICE(S)

The online HSPT Registration Form includes a list of Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of Washington that require the HSPT as part of their admissions process. As part of registration, students and their parents/guardians will select the high schools that should receive the student's HSPT score report. The High School Choice(s) window opens on **Monday, October 6, 2025**, and closes on **Sunday, December 14, 2025**. All high school selections must be finalized by the close of this window.



NOTICE OF ACCEPTANCE

Notices of acceptance or non-acceptance will be mailed via U.S. Mail to students by Catholic high schools in the Archdiocese of Washington on **Thursday, February 19, 2026, or Thursday, February 26, 2026.** The specific decision notification date for a particular Catholic high school can be obtained by contacting the Catholic high school directly or visiting the Catholic high school section at adweatholicschools.org.

TUITION ASSISTANCE

Each high school and the Archdiocese of Washington offer various tuition assistance and scholarship programs. Applying for tuition assistance has no bearing on whether a student is admitted to a school. Tuition assistance application deadlines are as early as January, so families will know their tuition assistance grants in the same timeframe and when they receive their decision notification letters from high schools.

FACTS administers the application process for the Archdiocesan Tuition Assistance Program. The FACTS Application Form for the 2026-2027 school year must be completed and submitted to FACTS by January 23, 2026, for families applying for tuition assistance from the archdiocese for a high school student. The form may be obtained in October 2025 at www.adwcatholicschools.org/tuition-assistance. All tuition assistance obtained through the archdiocese is based on financial need. Archdiocesan tuition assistance is open only to students currently enrolled in or applying to Catholic schools located in the archdiocese, which includes Washington, DC, and the five Maryland counties of Calvert, Charles, Montgomery, Prince George's, and St. Mary's.

Archdiocesan tuition assistance award amounts will be included in Catholic high school decision letters on **Thursday, February 19**, or **Thursday, February 26**, **2026**.

St. Anselm's Abbey School is a Catholic, Benedictine community that nurtures the spiritual, personal, and intellectual development of young men with demonstrated academic achievement through rigorous study of the liberal arts and sciences, preparing them for the demands of college and a life of learning and service to others. Founded in 1942, the School offers a rigorous classical liberal arts education and welcomes all students able to benefit from its programs regardless of religion, race, ethnicity, or economic status. ST. JOHN'S COLLEGE HIGH SCHOOL

St. John's is committed to academic excellence, as an independent, Catholic, Lasallian, coeducational, college preparatory school. Our 30+ acre campus is located adjacent to Rock Creek Park in Chevy Chase, DC. We offer 24 AP and 17 honors courses, a Scholars Program for gifted students, and a cross-curricular Entrepreneurial Program. Our 1:1 educational technology, featuring iPads provided by the school, allows students to learn, produce, and collaborate. The Class of 2025 earned over \$38 million in scholarships.

We are an active community offering over 70 clubs, 18 instrumental groups, 6 vocal groups, and 50 sports teams. Three full-time performance coaches provide professional-level training to all students. Upon graduation, students will have completed at least 90 hours of community service, with opportunities locally, nationally, and internationally.

St. John's has invested more than \$50 million in campus improvements over the last decade. This includes the Donatelli Center for the Arts and the Cap Mona Student Center, featuring a black box theater and the Lasallian Center for Mission and Ministry. The 80,000 square foot Performance and Leadership Center is home to athletic facilities, the Entrepreneurial Center and Cadet Corps Leadership Program.




STONE RIDGE SCHOOL OF THE SACRED HEART


TRANSPORTATION
